The team carried out four sessions during the month, with 91 offenders recorded out of 959 passing vehicles. So another month with almost 10% of all passing vehicles (during the sessions) exceeding the limit!

Kent police joined forces with members of the village Speedwatch team on Thursday 5th December to deliver a speed awareness session to the Year 6 children from the primary school, as part of their Geography field work. They walked around the village to look at all aspects of road safety. This plan soon snowballed and all the children were treated to a fun filled and very interesting school assembly, followed by an exciting tour of a police car and the speed camera van!
